With students spending a significant amount of time learning from home this year, access to the Internet in the home is no longer optional.

Bel Air, MD [November 17, 2020] - With many children learning virtually from home, having a reliable internet connection is essential. Harford County Education Foundation has partnered with Comcast to provide 12 months of Internet service to eligible families served by Harford County Public Schools through the company's Internet Essentials program.

"It is vital that we do all we can to ensure that our students have the tools and the access they need to succeed in this digital learning platform.
